Relevance: Your submission should focus on Pacific-related topics, but it does not have to be exclusively from a Pacific perspective.


Quality: We want original, thoughtful, and concise content about Pacific-related topics.

Length: Ideally, 800 to 1,200 words.

Submission: Email your work to pireport@eastwestcenter.org.

Deadlines: We accept submissions year-round but we review them in quarterly batches at the end of March, June, September, and December.
